Each club is asked to bring one duffel bag full of size 6 to 8 women’s white full briefs to the upcoming Sierra Nevada Region Conference April 27-29 at the Atlantis. This will enable the girls to attend school all month long. They have previously had to miss one week per month due to lack of underwear. You will be hearing more about this as we get closer to the conference.

President-Elect Gayle Baxley and the ad hoc fundraising committee did a terrific job in at the March business meeting. The club approved the committee’s recommendations. We will have a new ad hoc committee next year to consider and evaluate a potential hands-on service project that we can all work on with the same energy (or more) we’ve put forth for our Arts, Authors & Autos fundraisers. I emailed everyone the recommendations, but if you were not able to open the email or have any questions, please contact President-Elect Gayle or me. We are grateful for a wonderful donation to fund our scholarships as we work on a new service project. She also runs the chase crew that follows the balloon and is with it when it lands. Some of the benefits of her crew chief role are that she gets lots of free flights, pilot lessons, and good ratios of beer and champagne, along with munchies, at the end of each flight.

Eileen has two children, Stephanie (lives in Las Vegas and works at the Wynn) and Mark (lives in Sparks). Mark has given her three grandsons (14, 8, and 1) and a daughter-in-law also named Stephanie.

Tidbit of the Month *special feature by Faye Andersen*

March is Women's History Month

We've come a long way baby...from International (Working) Women's Day to National Women's History Month. Each March we celebrate Women's History Month, a time to re-examine and celebrate the wide range of women's contributions and achievements, too often overlooked in the telling of U.S. History.

But, did you know that what began as a demonstration by American women took prominence throughout the world before being officially celebrated in the United States.

International (Working) Women's Day is said to commemorate an 1857 march and demonstration in New York City by female garment and textile workers. The first declaration of International Women's Day on March 8, was declared at an international conference of women in Helsinki, Finland in 1910. A 50th anniversary observance was held in Peking China in 1960. On this day in Europe and Asia parades and demonstrations are held to honor women, especially working women. In Russia and the People's Republic of China it is a national holiday, and flowers or gifts are presented to women workers.

International Women's Day first came to prominence in the United States in the 1970s. In 1977 the National Women's History Project (NWHP), in conjunction with the Commission on the Status of Women in Sonoma County, Calif. began the first work towards recognizing the accomplishments of women on March 8. The idea quickly spread and in 1981 a joint resolution of Congress was introduced by Senator Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Representative Barbara Mikulski (D-MD) to proclaim the week of March 8 as Women's History Week.

The educational and nonprofit NWHP continued to promote the idea until Congress passed resolutions in 1987 declaring the entire month of March as Women's History Month. A proclamation is declared each year by Congress, then signed by the President of the United States.

The proclamation declares American women to often be overlooked and undervalued in history and calls upon all people to recognize the achievements and accomplishments of women in our nation.
